

How do I sign up?

If helping at Camp Barakel sounds like something you would like to try, follow these simple steps:

1. Download one of our Technician and Engineer application forms which will be posted on the website after January 1. The application form is in PDF file format. Click on the high school staff link on the home page to find it.
2. Print it out and then fill in all the information requested. Be sure to include all the information for your references.
3. Mail it in. Do not FAX the form. Your photo will not print at all on our FAX machine.
4. Give the pastoral reference form to your pastor or youth worker with a stamped envelope. Put Camp's mailing address on it.

If you apply you might be part of the approximately 180 teens accepted who will sacrifice part of their summer to change someone else's life.

You can feel free to photocopy the forms to share with family and friends, but do not save copies of this year's form for next year.

The form is also available by mail for those who can't get it from the website.

For those who do apply, we will send out our first batch of acceptance cards the first of February and then on a regular basis thereafter.

So think big!

Don't let any giant obstacles keep you from applying to serve the Lord at Camp Barakel.

WHAT IS IT?

It's a challenge! The Technician (high school girls) and Engineer (high school boys) Program of Camp Barakel is a proven way of exposing you to the rewarding concept of serving others. Many young people who have gone through the program have dedicated their lives in service to the Lord as missionaries and in their local church. Over the years some have become our own counselors, part-time staff and even resident missionary staff.

WHO CAN DO IT?

You — if you're a guy or gal going into the tenth, eleventh or twelfth grade in the fall. You must be at least 14 years old when you arrive to work. You may apply for your first time as a Technician or Engineer for one week. "Veterans" and individuals such as lifeguards or pianists may apply for two.

Incidentally, high school graduates may apply to join our college-age program called "Young Adult Program Staff." Contact us for details and an application.

WHAT WOULD I DO?

Christian Service! The typical daily work assignments for Technicians include dining hall, Trading Post, laundry, lifeguarding and handcrafts. Jobs for the Engineers include wood cutting and hauling,

lifeguarding, lawn mowing, painting, dishes and related kinds of jobs. The workday ranges from 6 to 7 hours depending on the assignment. Requests submitted at the time of application for a certain area will be honored when possible.

ALL WORK AND NO PLAY?

No way! Techs & Engineers enjoy times of spiritual growth and encouragement and participate in a wide range of recreational and off-duty activities. Lifelong friendships often result from time spent serving the Lord with others. Chapel messages, devotions and Biblical counseling are all geared to help you. The total program is supervised by our resident missionary staff and you'll have your own trained counselor just like our campers.

WHAT DOES IT COST ME?

Sweat! But there's no charge to serve in the program and you may use the camp bus transportation to and from Barakel FREE.

OK...THEN WHY DO THIS?

Eternal rewards. We supplement our overall summer camp ministry with individuals who are yielding their lives to God on a daily basis. We both gain. You give your services to the Lord and in return receive a week of ministry, fellowship and fun you'll

never forget. We all benefit as the Lord works in and through us.

WHAT IS CAMP BARAKEL?

Our name means "Where God has blessed." We are a non-denominational Christian camp that operates camps and retreats year-round. We are fundamental in doctrine and evangelical in ministry focus.
