

How do I sign up?

If working at Camp Barakel sounds like something you would like to try, follow these simple steps:

1. Download the application form which will be posted on our website in January. The form is in PDF file format. Click on the Staff/High School link on the home page to find it.
2. Print the application form and fill in all the information requested.
3. Mail it to Camp Barakel. Include "Summer Technician & Engineer Program" in the address.
4. Download and print three of the Technician & Engineer Reference forms.
5. Hand out those three reference forms to adults who know you well (other than family members). We want one of the three adults to be your pastor or a youth leader. Be sure to also give them an envelope with attached postage and Barakel's address so they can mail it directly to us.

You are welcome to photocopy the forms to share with friends. The form is also available by mail—please contact us.

We will begin accepting staff the first week of February.

Summer Technician & Engineer Program

What is it?

It's a challenge! The Technician (high school girls) and Engineer (high school boys) Program of Camp Barakel is a proven way of exposing you to the rewarding concept of serving others. Many young people who have gone through the program have dedicated their lives in service to the Lord as missionaries and in their local church. Over the years some have become our own counselors, part-time staff and even resident missionary staff.

Who can do it?

You – if you're a guy or gal going into the tenth, eleventh or twelfth grade in the fall. You must be at least 14 years old when you arrive to work. You may apply for your first time as a Technician or Engineer for one week. Returning Technicians and Engineers and lifeguards may apply for as many as five weeks.

High school graduates may apply for our college-age program called "Young Adult Program Staff." Contact us for details and an application.

What do I do?

Christian Service! The typical daily work assignments for Technicians include

dining hall, Trading Post, laundry, lifeguarding and handcrafts. Jobs for the Engineers include wood cutting and hauling, lifeguarding, lawn mowing, painting, dishes and related kinds of jobs. The workday ranges from 6 to 7 hours depending on the assignment.

All work and no play?

No way! Techs & Engineers enjoy times of Biblical teaching and encouragement and participate in a wide range of recreational and off-duty activities. Lifelong friendships often result from time spent serving the Lord with others. Chapel messages, devotions and talks with your counselor are all geared to help you. The program is supervised by our resident missionary staff and you'll have your own trained counselor just like our campers.

What's it cost me?

Sweat! But there's no charge to serve in the program and you may use the camp bus transportation to and from Barakel FREE.

OK...then why do this?

We supplement our overall summer camp ministry with individuals who are

yielding their lives to God on a daily basis. We both gain. You give your services to the Lord and in return receive a week of ministry, fellowship and fun you'll never forget. We all benefit as the Lord works in and through us.

What is Camp Barakel?

Our name means "Where God has blessed." We are a non-denominational Christian camp that operates camps and retreats year-round. We love proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and have an evangelical ministry focus. We want to see individuals brought to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ and to encourage believers to grow in obedience to the Lord.
