We offer a place where people come away from their routines and enjoy a concentrated gospel focus, but at Barakel we aim to encourage year around growth and service in the home church. Ordinary regular habits—like daily reading the Bible, attending church each week, partaking of the Lord's Supper, and praying with other disciples—are how God produces His fruit in our lives; faithfulness does not come in one explosive weekend breakthrough! When we understand this way that God works—the work that Barakel does will endure into eternity with the good pleasure of our heavenly Father.
